## HEALTHY AND SAFE SCHOOLS PLAN

### Introduction

Muddy Creek Charter School prioritizes Healthy and Safe Schools for our students, staff, and community. There are many aspects of building safety that require oversight and planning as well as ongoing education and proactive communication with our building occupants. This plan is to identify safety plans, district contacts, and access to current communications regarding each plan.

### 3. Radon

Muddy Creek Charter School is not required to develop a radon plan under ORS 332.167 because it is a charter school.

### 4. Lead in Drinking water

Upon recommendation by the Oregon Department of Education and Oregon Health Authority, and in compliance with EPA 3 Ts for Reducing Lead in Drinking Water in Schools, the district will:

- 1. Identify sources of lead:** Schools and childcare facilities should test all taps used for drinking or food preparation in the building to identify any lead problems. Follow the Environmental Protection Agency's 3 T's Revised Technical Guidance to ensure that samples for lead are



collected properly and from the right places. Use an OHA-accredited drinking water laboratory to analyze samples for lead.

2. **Stop access:** Prevent access to water taps that have more than 20 parts per billion (ppb) of lead. This should include shutting off taps, covering water fountains, and providing bottled water to students and staff members.
3. **Communicate:** Make results from tests for lead in water available to students, families, and the community as quickly as possible. Lead results will be posted on the district's website at: <http://www.muddycreekcharterschool.org/news>
4. **Mitigate and correct:** Replace the sources of lead in building plumbing. Again, EPA 3T's Guidance should be followed.

## **5. Lead Paint**

In order to comply with the United States Environmental Protection Agency's Renovation, Repair and Painting Program Rule, the district will only contract with certified lead based paint renovation contractors licensed by the Oregon Construction Contractors Board.

## **6. Integrated Pest Management**

The district has adopted an integrated pest management plan as required by ORS 634.700 through 634.750. Community members can access a copy of the IPM [here](#) and at the district site.

## **7. Communication**

The district will make all test results and detailed information explaining the test results available to the public within five business days of receiving the results. Results will be made available by posting the results on the district website, sending notice of the results over the email system, and making the results available in hardcopy at the main administration office.
