## "Our bus route is unique." –Dan Hays

Our bus route is unique as a bus route. In town a school bus route travels within walking distance of most students' homes. On the other hand, our bus route is often letting children off a long way from the child's home. This puts a unique responsibility upon all of us. Through the efforts of parents, we do have pretty good system for safety and getting children home.

However, we are experiencing some serious challenges that alarm a large number of people. This week an adult was not present to pick up a student from the drop-off point. If the bus driver knows it, he is to drive the student back to the school for safety reasons.

However, in our system, there is a parent at each bus stop making sure children are connecting with the responsible adult. The bus driver assumes the right child and adult have connected. I'm asking all adults and children to help us in this matter.

In the eventuality a child is left with an adult not there to pick the child up, these are the steps I would like parents to know AND ASK PARENTS TO HELP THEIR CHILDREN KNOW:

1) No adult there

- i) Notify our parent on duty at the stop and the bus driver.
- ii) The bus driver and the onduty parent decide what is to be done.
- iii) The parent takes the child, or the bus driver returns the child to school.
- 2) ANOTHER CRITICAL POINT -PHONE CALLS MUST BE MADE BACK TO SCHOOL( 541.752.0377), TO THE CHILD'S PARENT, DAN HAYS, AND MELISSA HARRIS (541.602.4865)

We are in the midst of a "child identification" project: putting a tag on the backpack of every bus-riding student with name, phone number, and back up phone number for each student.

This step is not one I like to do, but worse is a child with no adult to be sure they are safe and no way to reach someone for help and notification.

Our intent with these steps is to get several adults involved in securing the safety of the child. This gets a network going that stretches to the Corvallis School District. In the most recent incident, too much time went by before I knew about it. Please do not hesitate - ever - to call me. I have a number of tools at my disposal to get right on the matter.
