



OPERATIONAL BLUEPRINT FOR SCHOOL REENTRY 2020-21

Under ODE’s **Ready Schools, Safe Learners** guidance, each school¹ has been directed to submit a plan to the district² in order to provide on-site and/or hybrid instruction. Districts must submit each school’s plan to the local school board and make the plans available to the public. This form is to be used to document a district’s, school’s or program’s plan to ensure students can return for the 2020-21 school year, in some form, in accordance with Executive Order 20-25(10). Schools must use the [Ready Schools, Safe Learners guidance](#) document as they complete their Operational Blueprint for Reentry. With a desire to support the diverse needs of students, families, and employees of Muddy Creek Charter School, equity has been our main focus. For the health and safety of our students, staff and community, MCCS decided to start all students in CDL until at least October 19th. We will evaluate returning in-person to schools after that time and will reopen school buildings when it is safe to do so.

It is deeply frustrating that there is still uncertainty about how we can safely open schools while we are seeing increasing numbers of positive cases of COVID-19 in our state. We want to open schools for students and a great deal of thoughtful outreach and planning has taken place to make that possible, but at the same time, the safety and health of our staff, students, and community is our first priority.

During August 2020:

- Families may choose to between MCCS’ Hybrid Model or CDL Model.
- K-3 Students enrolled in the Hybrid Model will participate in remote learning until October 19th (metrics allowing).
- MCCS’ Students in grades 4-5 enrolled in the Hybrid Model will return to school one week after metrics allow.
- MCCS’ CDL Model is taught by MCCS teachers utilizing synchronous and asynchronous lessons.

The school year will begin as scheduled, with September 9 as the first day of school. Consistent with the RSSL guidance, Muddy Creek Charter School will use the [FOLLOWING METRICS - Criteria for In-Person Instruction](#) document provided by ODE and OHA to determine when to return to in-person instruction.

Update: MCCS plans to end CDL and return to Hybrid Learning on October 19, 2020 pending metrics. A Hybrid Operational Blueprint has been developed and continues to be revised for application when in-person instruction is implemented.
