Meeting minutes:

- PTO sponsored special needs parents support group Jamie reported back that parents may not have their own Town Hall due to HIPAA rules, so it is suggested that PTO sponsored this group. Jamie volunteers to sponsor this group once a month.
 - Jamie will organize when the meetings will be held and will follow up with Saffron who will email out through PTO email
 - Tyler agrees that a group like this would be helpful for parents to be able to communicate with each other. The turnover of Special Ed teachers has been hard on the students, and the group might add a layer of support.

 - Suzanne will do a write up and an example

- Perhaps the picture in the basket is the one that goes onto the tree
- Tyler brought up a family craft day displaying photos of kids on the wall, holding up a sign
 - Maybe a communal craft day with photos
 - Are we allowed to do an outdoor CB activity, like an invasive species removal work party
 - Les responded that the restrictions are starting to lift and we can
 do some of these things, but maybe not so structured
 - Jamie mentioned that there used to be a lot of community building things that got wiped out from COVID - June campout, Mary's Peak Trip
 - Suzanne suggested a monthly/weekly hike where families sign up (limit to 5 families) and you get to meet new folks each time you sign up
 - Les brought up community bulletin board, Jamie said things can go out in monthly newsletter also
